Portico Healthnet's mission is to reduce the number of people without coverage for health care services.

## ABOUT US

Portico Healthnet helps low-income, uninsured Minnesotans **enroll** in health care coverage, **understand** how to use the health care system, and **access** community resources. Portico's multi-lingual, culturally competent staff help navigate the complicated process of finding and understanding health care coverage. With increased access to primary and preventive care, clients' overall health improves and unnecessary and costly emergency department visits and hospitalizations decrease.



## CHALLENGES TO HEALTH CARE ACCESS

Despite reaching an historic low of **4.3%** in 2015, Minnesota's uninsurance rate rose to **6.3%** in 2017. Certain groups of Minnesotans continue to have higher rates of uninsurance: young adults (**10.9%**); persons with incomes below 200% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL) (**11.3%**); those with a high school education or less (**11.9%**); people of color and American Indians (**13.9%**).

Declines in coverage present serious concerns about the ability of Minnesota families to access timely, quality medical services. According to the 2017 Minnesota Health Care Access Survey, of those who were uninsured:

- **46%** reported forgoing care due to cost.
- **47%** had no usual source of health care.
- **38%** had little or no confidence in getting needed care.
- **51%** were potentially eligible for public health care coverage.

Of those who had insurance:

**20%** reported complexities to staying insured were a barrier to obtaining and maintaining coverage.

*Portico addresses these challenges by helping underserved communities access health coverage and care.*

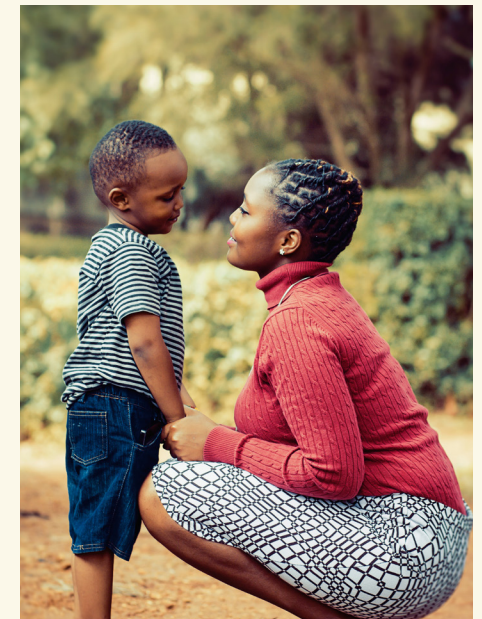

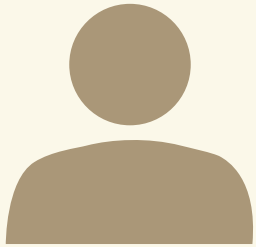
