## **Section 2: Core Rights Matching**

Right to Privacy	You must be told about the risks, benefits, and alternatives before treatment.
Right to Refuse Treatment	Your health records and conversations with providers are confidential.
Right to Emergency Care	You can receive care in an emergency regardless of your ability to pay.


